Rampur Raza Library & Museum

The world fame Rampur Raza Library & Museum was founded by Nawab Faizullah Khan in 1774. It was taken over by the Government of India in 1975 by an act of Parliament. It is functioning under the Ministry of Culture, Government of India. Honorable Governor of Uttar Pradesh is the Chairman of the Rampur Raza Library Board.

The Rampur Raza Library & Museum has a collection of approximately 17,000 manuscripts & rare items including 150 illustrated manuscripts with 4000 illustrations, 1,000 miniature paintings in 35 albums 2,000 specimens of Islamic calligraphy in 84 calligraphy albums, 300 Art objects, 1300 historical coins and approximately 65,000 printed books.

The rich collection also includes art objects, astronomical instruments and historical coins. The holding of the Library covers the ancient and medieval languages such as Arabic, Persian, Sanskrit, Turkey, Pushto, Hindi and Urdu languages. The manuscripts in these languages represent all important subjects including History, Philosophy, Religion, Science, Literature, Arts and Architecture. The miniature paintings represent the Turk-Mongol, Mughal, Persian, Rajput, Deccani, Pahari, Awadh and Anglo European schools of art which are considered immensely valuable for research scholars. In addition to the manuscripts, the printed book section has a unique importance and this section contains hundreds of rare Arabic, Persian, Urdu and Hindi books, which are now out of print and considered important for research work and are carefully preserved.

The Library and Museum is housed in a century and a half old magnificent palace of Hamid Manzil in the fort of Rampur. It is an excellent specimen of Indo – European architecture of northern India. It has an Italian sculpture gallery with niches and canopied ceilings decorated with seventeen attractive Italian marble statues of 17th & 18th centuries, and a dozen spacious rooms with a stupendous Darbar Hall highly embellished in gold. The open area around the palatial mansions was developed into a decorative garden of Mughal Chahar Bagh pattern with water channels, fountains, tanks and beautiful selected flora. Wide and deep water channels have been constructed with Kota stone pathway rendering a graceful finish to the surrounding environment.




रामपुर रजा लाइब्रेरी एवं संग्रहालय

विश्व प्रसिद्ध रामपुर रजा लाइब्रेरी एण्ड म्यूजियम की स्थापना रामपुर के प्रथम शासक नवाब फैजुल्लाह खाँ ने 1774 ई० में की थी। 1975 में पार्लियमेंट एकत्र के तहत यह भारत सरकार के अधीन तथा संस्कृति मंत्रालय, के अन्तर्गत एक स्वायत्त संस्था के रूप में तथा एक बोर्ड की निगरानी में कार्य कर रहा है। माननीय राज्यपाल उत्तर प्रदेश रामपुर रजा लाइब्रेरी एण्ड म्यूजियम बोर्ड के अध्यक्ष हैं।

रामपुर रजा लाइब्रेरी एण्ड म्यूजियम में लगभग 17,000 पाण्डुलिपियाँ और दुर्लभ वस्तुएँ हैं जिनमें 150 चित्रित पाण्डुलिपियाँ 4000 चित्रों के साथ, 35 एलबमों के 1000 लघुचित्र, 84 कैलीग्राफी एलबमों में 2000 इस्लामिक कैलीग्राफी के नमूने, 300 कला-कृतियाँ, 1300 ऐतिहासिक सिक्के समिलित हैं तथा विभिन्न भाषाओं में लगभग 65,000 मुद्रित पुस्तकें उपलब्ध हैं।

इस अनमोल संग्रह में कलाकृतियाँ, ज्योतिषशास्त्र उपकरण तथा ऐतिहासिक सिक्के समिलित हैं। पुस्तकालय संग्रह में अरबी, फारसी, संस्कृत, तुर्की, पर्सी, हिन्दी तथा उर्दू भाषा जैसी प्राचीन, मध्यकालीन तथा भारतीय भाषाएँ समिलित हैं। इन भाषाओं में पाण्डुलिपियाँ, इतिहास, दर्शनशास्त्र, धर्म, विज्ञान, साहित्य कला एवं वास्तुकला जैसे महत्वपूर्ण विषयों पर पाण्डुलिपियाँ, प्राचीन तथा आधुनिक युग की प्रकाशित पुस्तकें संग्रहित हैं। लघु चित्र तुर्क-मंगोल, मुगल, पश्चिम, राजपूत, पहाड़ी, अवध तथा एंलॉ-यूरोपियन कलाविद्या प्रदर्शित करते हैं जिन्हें शोधकर्ताओं के लिये अत्यधिक महत्वपूर्ण माना गया है। पाण्डुलिपियों के अतिरिक्त मुद्रित पुस्तक विभाग का एक अलग ही महत्व है। इस विभाग में अरबी, फारसी, उर्दू तथा हिन्दी की सैकड़ों दुर्लभ पुस्तकें हैं। जिनके प्रकाशन उपलब्ध नहीं हैं। यह पुस्तकें शोधकार्य के लिए अत्यधिक महत्वपूर्ण हैं और उचित ढंग से संरक्षित हैं।

यह लाइब्रेरी एण्ड म्यूजियम रामपुर किले में लगभग 150 साल पुरानी हामिद मंजिल की इमारत में स्थित है। यह भव्य इमारत इण्डो-यूरोपियन भवन निर्माण कला का उत्कृष्ट उदाहरण है। इस लाइब्रेरी एण्ड म्यूजियम में मूर्तियों की एक गैलरी है जिसमें 17वीं तथा 18वीं शताब्दी की 17 आकर्षक इटेलियन संगमरमर से निर्मित मूर्तियाँ सुरक्षित हैं। इस गैलरी में बने हुए ताक एवं दरबार हॉल की चमकदार छत को शुद्ध सोने से अलंकृत किया गया है जो इसको और शानदार बनाते हैं। इस भव्य इमारत के चारों ओर खाली स्थान को मुगल शैली की 'चार बाग' प्रणाली से शोभायुक्त बगीचे के रूप में विकसित किया गया, जिसमें फवारे, नहरें और सुन्दर एवं चुनिन्दा पौधे लगाये गये हैं। इस स्थान को अत्यधिक आकर्षित बनाने के लिए पानी की गहरी नहरों के ऊपर चारों ओर सुन्दर ढंग से कोटा पत्थर लगाये गये थे।




